




Best Practices







Very short, and a quick read, but it has more impact than you would expect from such a slim volume. While I was initially put off by the lack of quotation marks for the dialogue, ultimately I think that this choice gave the narrative a kind of immediacy and a greater intimacy with the Captain's perspective. While there are some lovely descriptions of the natural world as the Captain and Johanna pass through it, by and large the prose is direct and spare, which I like. The pairing of old man and young girl traveling together through rough country inevitably calls to mind True Grit, and the young heroine certainly displays an abundance of that characteristic. Caught between two worlds and destined to never truly belong to either, her existence in the in-between is poignant and haunting. (As Doris says, she is both "not-real" and "not not-real.") The bond forged between her and the Captain feels very genuine, and the ways they both help each other survive -- on a literal level but also on that deeper plane of the soul -- makes this story sing.




Definitely mixed feelings about this. On the one hand, for what it is - a romantic comedy about a man with (undiagnosed) Asperger Syndrome and his project to find the perfect mate - it's very well written. It's fun, at times funny, and romantic in places. On the other hand, it often feels like Don's autism is used solely as a vehicle for comedy. And, while I'm not an expert in the subject, I question some of the information shared. Don feels the need to follow a strict routine; any deviation from the schedule causes him extreme discomfort (typical among those with autism). But the author implies that, with just a little effort, schedules and routines can be broken without any lasting repercussions. From my (limited) knowledge of Asperger's, I doubt that's the case.

It seems that Simsion had an opportunity here to tell a funny, engaging story, while at the same time giving factual information about autism; it appears (at least to me) that he didn't manage to do that.




Tags

- Tags dynamically group more than 100 items together
- Indexed and searchable
- Permanent URL that can be shared
- Don't recreate information from the title page
- More subjective than subject headings
- Use approachable, descriptive language



Tags

- Tags are ultimately meant to index - adding titles to existing tags can be very useful!
- Add to popular tags
- Find tags with moderate results, and look for titles you can add
- What would be useful if you were describing a title?





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
