### GENERAL RECOMMENDATIONS Only Connect: The Literature, Lives, and Loves of the Bloomsbury Group

In 1929, author E.M. Forster called the network of intellectuals and artists known as the Bloomsbury Group the "only genuine movement in English civilization". What began as a series of intense conversations about philosophy, art, and morality among friends produced some of the most influential works across several realms of culture: literature (Forster and Virginia Woolf), art (Duncan Grant), criticism (Lytton Strachey and Roger Fry), politics (Leonard Woolf), and economics (John Maynard Keynes). The group was formed in the early 1910s and went strong for decades, even after the deaths of core members.

Bloomsburyites openly questioned the strict morality of the Victorians and were heavily influenced by philosopher G.E. Moore, who espoused the primacy of aesthetic appreciation and interpersonal relationships. The members also held very modern attitudes about gender and sexuality - many of them were romantically involved in same- and opposite-sex pairings with each other over the years; some even had open marriages. The Bloomsbury Group's philosophical and political ethos played out faithfully in both their art and their personal lives. The famous epigraph from Forster's novel Howards End exemplifies the attitude that art and personal relationships are the key to living well: "Only connect! ... Only connect the prose and the passion, and both will be exalted, and human love will be seen at its height. Live in fragments no longer."

This list includes fiction and non-fiction works by Bloomsbury Group members, biographies, film adaptations, criticism, modern novels about Virginia Woolf, and even a cookbook.


